



# Carry the Flame

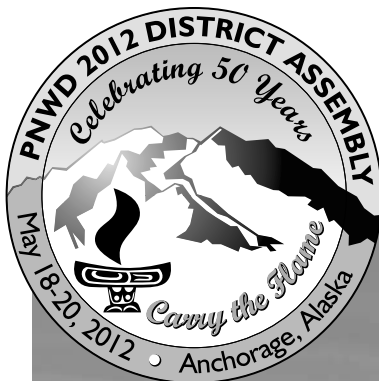

## SESSION ONE

### IA Nurturing Fire of Commitment: Small Group Justice Ministries

- *Rev. Deborah Holder, MDiv, MSW*  
Explore congregation-based justice ministry (regardless of issue), gaining insight into social change in the context of religious community. Spiritual leadership tools and practices are shared to integrate two yearnings today — social change and spiritual integrity.

### IB Sharing the Good News of Unitarian Universalism

- *Rev. Dr. James Kubal-Komoto*  
Learn an easy-to-remember, tested and 100-percent guaranteed method for talking about Unitarian Universalism with strangers, with children and youth in their congregations, or with anybody.

### IC Growing the Flame: Growth Tune-up with Tandi

- *Tandi Rogers, CRE*  
Unpack the dynamics of growth using a simple framework. Learn about Meade's model of growth using examples and stories. Leaders will connect to resources, including other congregations and leaders.

### ID The Transgender Experience: A Call to Social Action

- *Hayden Nevill*  
Discuss transgender people and associated social justice issues from the perspective of a transgender man. Learn how congregations can improve their welcome to transgender members/visitors and provide opportunities for social action.

### IE Carriers of our Free Faith

- *Rev. Dr. Terasa Cooley*  
The Unitarian Universalist Association is just that — an association. Learn how to be a participant in a larger UU faith, how the UU denomination works and how to build a vital UU identity.

### IF Transforming Nominating Committees... to Leadership Development Teams

Small nominating committees with a short-term goal of developing a slate of elected leaders do not meet the needs of dynamic, healthy congregations. Explore another model for recruiting, developing, orienting and supporting religious leaders.

Traditional models are insufficient for today's church governance. Review traditional governance models. Explore technical and adaptive challenges, meaning/value of covenant in UU congregational polity, and covenantal governance to support adaptive leadership.

- *Rev. Tera Little, MDiv*  
Learn how to plan and lead a justice trip grounded in UU values and steeped in theological reflection. Includes basic event planning steps, coalition building, theological reflection preparation, and multi-generational program development.

Discuss the spiritual effects of trauma and loss and ways to support one another through trauma in our UU congregations. Learn how a traumatized congregation may seek support from other congregations and the UUA.

Learn about classical and folk music of non-Euro-American cultures and explore these as traditional means of expressing the human condition. Discuss music as an expression of humanism and spirituality.

## Children & Youth Programs

The District Assembly Planning Team is organizing special programs designed to enrich the assembly experience for families with children. Half-hour orientation meetings will be held early Friday evening. Children/Youth **MUST** be pre-registered in order to participate. Get a **discount** with registration by **April 3** (\$125) vs. by April 26 (\$150)

Child/Youth registration must be received **no later than April 26, 2012** to plan for sufficient resources. There is **NO LATE or ON-SITE REGISTRATION**.

**Pre-school (Ages 1-4)** religious exploration and child care will be available Friday evening, all day Saturday, and on Sunday morning to allow parents/sponsors to attend assembly functions. Parents pick up children for meals (lunch & dinner).

**The Children's Program** is designed for elementary school children (K - 5th grade). The program from 8:45 a.m. to 5:00 p.m. Saturday includes field trips to engaging and educational venues in downtown Anchorage, games and picnic in downtown area parks, and fun activities within the hotel.

**The Youth Program** is designed for pre-teen/teen ages.

- **Junior High** (6th - 8th grade) — 8:45 a.m. to 5:00 p.m. Saturday — includes a day of exploring Anchorage with visits to downtown attractions and a bike or hike excursion with picnic lunch. Depending on weather, several other activities in the hotel and around downtown are planned.
- **Senior High** (9th-12th grade) will participate in DA workshops and meetings along with lunch-time and evening activities. Senior Youth may also participate in a special Youth Worship Service Saturday evening and a lock-in overnight Saturday night at the Anchorage UU Fellowship building.

## Young Adult Program

The schedule is infused with several opportunities for young adults (YA) — ages 18 (graduated from high school) to 35 — to meet, discuss and engage with one another. YAs will attend general sessions and workshops on Saturday. Plans also call for a Friday evening meet-and-greet and a pizza dinner (pizza cost is not part of registration); Friday late evening outdoor activity; Saturday meet-ups including breakfast check-in and a picnic lunch-and-walk downtown, and a Sunday morning wrap-up discussion. To participate, check the YA age group on the registration form.

## Assembly Choir

Assembly attendees have an opportunity to join with fellow UUs, raising your voice in song during the Sunday morning worship service. Rehearsal times will be announced soon. Indicate your interest in participating in the 2012 PNWD District Assembly choir on the registration form.

# Assembly Logistics: Delegates, Travel & Lodging

**QUICK GUIDE TO PNWD-UUA:** The Pacific Northwest District (PNWD) is one of 19 districts that embrace the 1,103 self-governing congregations in covenant as members of the Unitarian Universalist Association (UUA). The UUA is governed by a volunteer board of trustees elected by and from the districts. Each district is governed by a volunteer board of directors elected by its member congregations. District staff and volunteers provide local services to help congregations thrive; UUA staff and volunteers do the same on a national level. The four westernmost districts comprise the UUA's Pacific Western Region – Pacific Northwest, Pacific Southwest, Pacific Central, and Mountain Desert. The PNWD serves 59 member congregations in Alaska, western Idaho, Oregon and Washington, and covers over 800,000 square miles of land — the largest in the UUA. PNWD congregations currently count over 9,400 adult members – the sixth largest in the UUA. The Church of the Larger Fellowship (CLF) provides a virtual congregation for UUs who are geographically isolated or simply seeking additional connection. It has nearly 3,500 members, and those who reside in the PNWD may convene each year at District Assembly. There they elect delegates who join peers from member congregations to vote on PNWD items of business and enjoy fellowship with one another. **DELEGATE CERTIFICATION:** If your congregation wishes to have delegate representation at District Assembly, a completed Delegate Certification Form must be submitted by **Thursday, May 10, 2012**. Details for this online certification will be sent to congregations in mid-March.

**CLF DELEGATE PARTICIPATION:** Church of the Larger Fellowship members living in the geographical area of the PNWD may caucus to elect two delegates to attend the business meeting. Upon arrival on site, CLF members should use the meeting message board to set the time and place for their

caucus. Once CLF delegates are determined, they must report to the PNWD Delegate Table for membership confirmation and to receive their voting credentials.

**RESOLUTIONS:** In order for proposed resolutions to be considered at the 2012 District Assembly, they must be received in the PNWD office by **March 19, 2012**. Such resolutions must first be approved by a duly-called meeting of the submitting congregation.

## WhaleCoast Alaska

*WhaleCoast Alaska* is a tour program sponsored by Alaska UU congregations. The 9-day, 8-night tour of Alaska begins May 20, and features spectacular experiences in nature, scenic travel on the Alaska Railroad, and warm UU home hospitality. 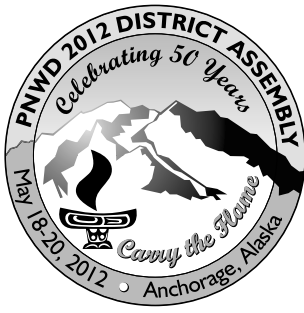

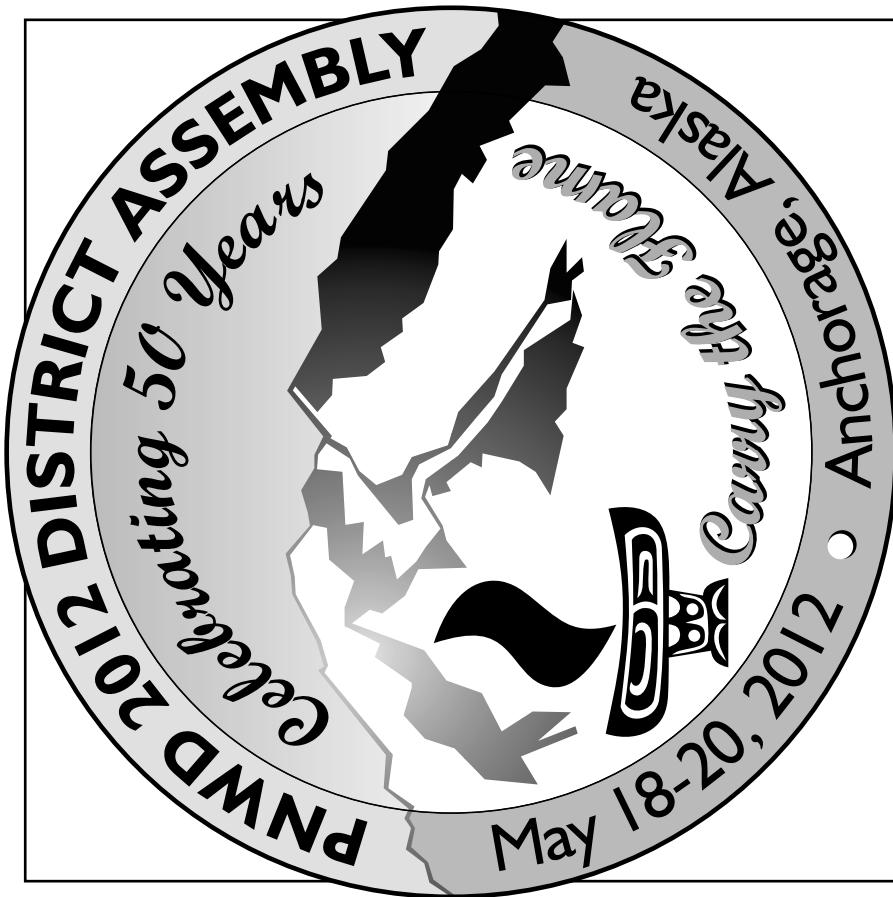
